Daniel Alexander, DO, FHRS, FACC

Dr. Alexander is an electrophysiologist with Winchester Cardiology and Vascular Medicine|Valley Health and serves Chairman of the Winchester Medical Center Electrophysiology Clinical Council. He completed his medical education at A.T. Still University of Health Sciences at Kirksville College of Osteopathic Medicine. He completed his residency at William Beaumont Hospital and a fellowship at Virginia Commonwealth University. He is board certified in cardiovascular disease, internal medicine, and clinical cardiac electrophysiology.

Saif Al Najafi, MD

Dr. Al Najafi is a cardiologist with Winchester Cardiology and Vascular Medicine|Valley Health and Medical Director, Cardiac Imaging. He completed his medical education at Al-Mustanseriya University and residency at St. John Hospital & Medical Center. Dr. Al Najafi completed fellowships at St. John Hospital & Medical Center and Emory University Medical Center. He is board certified in clinical cardiology, nuclear cardiology, echocardiography, and internal medicine. Dr. Al Najafi's clinical interests include family history of premature heart disease, bicuspid aortic valve, cardiomyopathy, and cardiotoxic chemotherapy; resistant hypertension; heart failure; coronary artery disease; valvular heart disease; palpitations; and arrhythmias.

Dr. Bin Abdulhak is an interventional and structural cardiologist with Winchester Cardiology and Vascular Medicine|Valley Health. He obtained his internal medicine training from Strong Memorial Hospital, University of Rochester Medical Center with a distinction in medical education. He completed his cardiology

fellowship at Penn State Heart and Vascular Institute at Hershey Medical Center. He then pursued interventional cardiology fellowship at Stony Brook Heart Institute, Stony Brook University Medical Center. Dr. Lall is board certified in internal medicine, cardiovascular disease, interventional cardiology, and nuclear cardiology. His clinical interests include coronary artery disease, percutaneous coronary intervention, chronic total occlusion (CTO) intervention, complex and high risk coronary intervention (CHIP), structural and valvular heart disease including structural heart procedures such as Transcatheter Aortic Valve Replacement (TAVR). He is dedicated to advancing rapid, evidence based care for patients presenting with acute coronary syndromes through his clinical practice and leadership.

Lindsey Prescher, DO

Dr. Prescher is a cardiothoracic surgeon with Valley Health Cardiothoracic Surgery. She completed her medical education at Lake Erie College of Osteopathic Medicine, followed by general surgery internship and fellowship at Navy Medical Center in San Diego. Dr. Prescher completed her cardiothoracic surgery fellowship at the Yale University School of Medicine, followed by an additional year of advanced training as a fellow in structural heart disease at Yale.
